VERBAL CONSENT STATEMENT – FOR HOUSEHOLDS

“Hello. How are you? My name is [ENUMERATOR NAME], and I am working with a team from the Ministry of Community Development, Mother and Child Health in Lusaka. We are conducting a survey of households in this district, and your household was randomly chosen to be interviewed in this community.

We would like to ask you some questions about your household and community. We are asking you these questions to find out more about your household, your household's economic activities, health, education, and other measures of well-being. We would like to interview youths in your household between the ages of 15 to 19 to understand aspects like their health and schooling.

We hope that this information will eventually benefit the entire community by allowing us to understand your living conditions that households like yours face, and ways to better support households like you. Information you share will help the Ministry of Community Development, Mother and Child Health better target services and opportunities in communities like yours, but there is no direct benefit to your household for participating in the survey. Approximately 3000 families are participating in this study across Zambia.

It will take approximately 1 1/2 hours to complete this questionnaire. This study is a three year study, and we may come back again in the future to ask you more questions. We will not disclose any information about you, your family or your child to anyone outside of this study. The only instance—and such occasions are rare—when we would release information about you to anyone outside the project would be if we learned someone, including you were in danger of harm. We will keep everything that you tell me private and confidential. Your name will be kept private and separate from the information you provide, in a secure office and on a password protected computer. All data will be reported in the aggregate only and reports developed from the study that will be disseminated will contain only aggregate level data. Data collected for the study will be maintained in a secure location, according to standard study procedures, and will be destroyed once all reporting activities are completed.
