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RETHINKING PURPOSE

- MIS for the organization

- An information system is "a set of procedures that collects (or retrieves), processes, stores, and disseminates information to support decision making and control.
- Information systems are formal, computer based systems that play an integral role in organizations.



WHAT MAKES A GOOD SYSTEM

- Developed around organizational readiness
 - anticipated and desired change identified,
 - aligned with vision, mission, and strategic plan,
 - resources available to begin development,
 - active organizational champion,
 - stakeholder support,
 - clear ownership over the system.

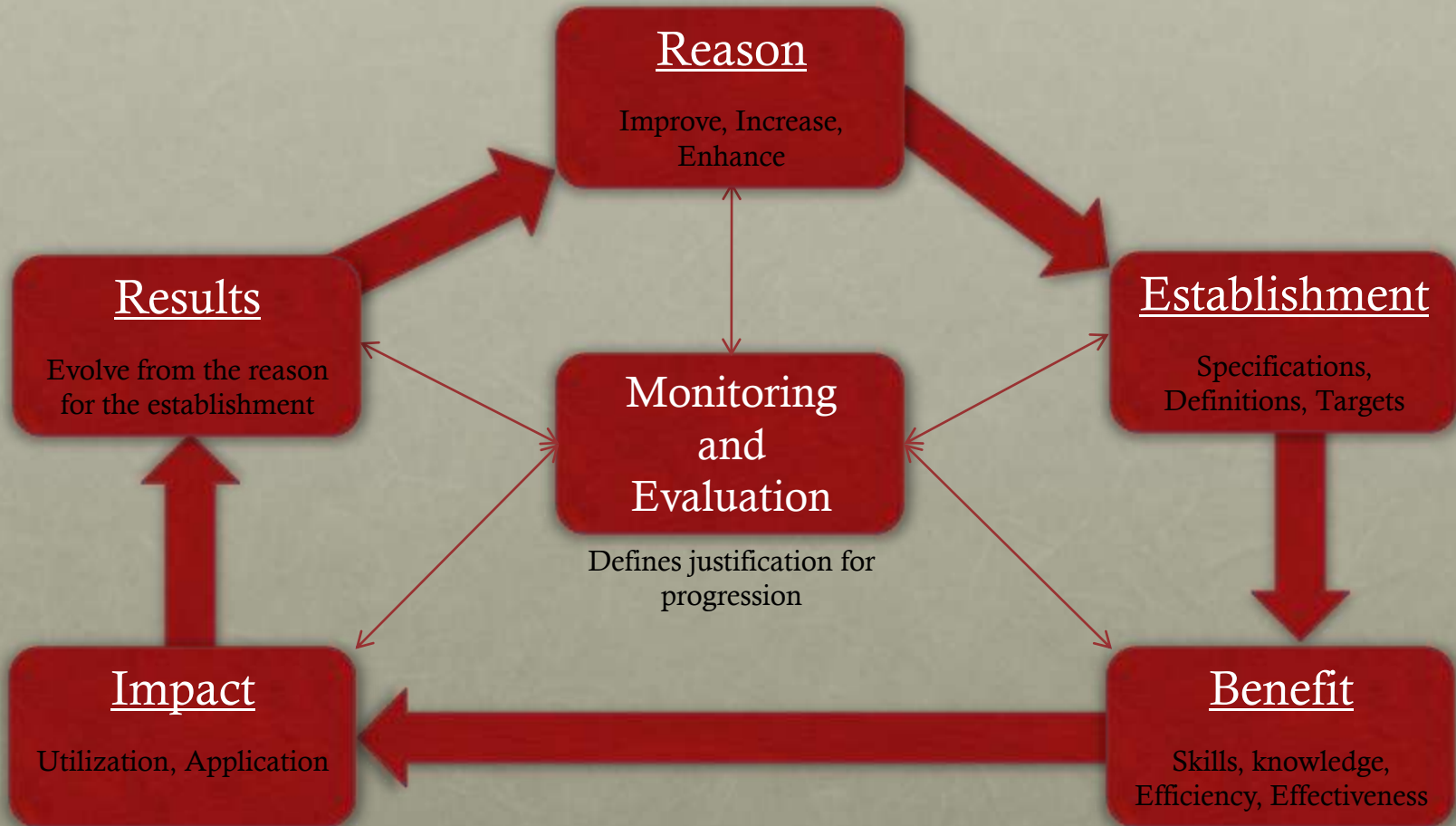
SOUND STRATEGIC CHOICE

- Avoid ad hoc system development
 - Complicated manual procedures,
 - Users lack confidence,
 - New system is cumbersome and time-consuming,
 - Some of the functionality remains unused,
 - Users learn quirks of the system,
 - Manual processes are used.

OUTCOMES OF SOUND CHOICES

- Optimal organizational performance
 - ensures the accurate and timely management of data,
 - minimizes error,
 - enhances information access and dissemination,
 - meets cross-cutting requirements such as:
 - Governance and Institutional Coordination
 - Infrastructure and Human Resources
 - Application Management

SUCCESSFUL CT SYSTEMS

- National Project and Not Isolated Endeavor
 - provide information services to many organizational stakeholders,
 - decentralized design providing information services to users in a cost-efficient manner,
